HOW TO GET THERE

By public transport

The best way to reach Stuttgart-Uhlbach is by public transport.
Take the S-Bahn S1 to Obertürkheim (travel time from Stuttgart main station: 12 minutes). From there, take the bus No. 62 to the terminus at Uhlbach (travel time: 5 minutes). The Museum of Viniculture is directly opposite the bus stop.

By car

You can reach the Museum of Viniculture in Uhlbach from the centre of Stuttgart in just a few minutes via the B10 trunk road in the direction of Esslingen. Exit at Obertürkheim/Hedelfingen. Turn left over the bridge and then right to Obertürkheim. Follow the road to Uhlbach, where you can't miss the Museum of Viniculture: it is located right in the centre of the village on Uhlbacher Platz.

TRADITIONAL AND MODERN

Museum

Stuttgart-Uhlbach is not just a delightful little wine-growing community with a long tradition. It's also the heart of Swabian wine culture: 2000 years of wine-growing history in the Middle Neckar region are gathered together under one roof at the Stuttgart Museum of Viniculture in the former Old Winepress in Uhlbach. The huge timbered building dating from the year 1907 was thoroughly modernised and many new highlights were added to the exhibition.

The glass Vinothek

The main eyecatcher inside Uhlbach's Old Winepress is the new Vinothek extending over two floors, whose uncluttered design tunes in perfectly with the original structure. Within its pleasant ambience visitors can sample the first-class wines produced by Stuttgart's vintners and take some of their favourites home with them. From the spacious glass construction guests have a good view of the interior architecture of the historical building – an ideal place to linger for those thirsting after both wine and knowledge.

Even if you've already been to the museum, the Vinothek is always worth another visit and looks forward to welcoming you during museum opening hours!

A wine tasting to round off your visit

On the wine list of the museum's Vinothek you'll find first-class wines produced by more than 22 different Stuttgart vintners and sparkling



wine producers. The selection of wines and champagnes alternates every second month, so there are always new and delicious varieties to discover – which you can also take home with you. Snacks from the kitchen complement the wines on offer. By prior arrangement there are also wine tastings available with choice local wines that demonstrate Stuttgart's diversity as a wine-growing region, with short commentaries on the different wines sampled.

All you've ever wanted to know about wine

Rare exhibits from past centuries in state-of-the-art museum architecture give an overview of the production methods and characteristics of wine. The exhibition takes you through the long history and the many different properties of the juice of the vine, which has enjoyed great popularity in the region of Swabia ever since the early 12th century. Find out all about historical and contemporary wine-producing techniques and the original equipment used, smell for yourself the characteristic fruit aromas in the wine bouquet, learn how the Swabian "Bodagfährtle" (terroir) influences the flavour and discover lots more interesting and curious facts about wine in general.

Wine in Art

The elaborate woodcarvings, charcoal drawings and oil paintings of the well-known Stuttgart artist Eugen Häfele (1922-2008) are dedicated to the theme of wine and depict scenes from the everyday work of the vintners.



GROUP OFFERS

A great idea for group excursions

We offer informative and entertaining guided tours of the exhibition for groups in English. Here you'll not only learn all you need to know about viniculture and wine producing, the consolidation of the vineyards and the work of the wine growers, but also hear lots of stories and anecdotes on the subject of wine. (Duration: approx. 45 minutes)

After the tour you'll have the opportunity of sampling some of Stuttgart's wines with an expert in the Vinothek. The museum and Vinothek also open on request outside regular opening hours. Group tours are available only by prior arrangement.

Vineyard delight – Walking tour around the Württemberg

There is a lot to see and to experience in one of Stuttgart's most gorgeous wine regions. The hike with your guide starts from S-Bahn stop Untertürkheim and goes through the vineyards of Württemberg – with one of the most beautiful viewpoints where you'll see the stunning views of Stuttgart from above.

Our guide will explain to you a lot about wine and wine growing, the stories of course filled with interesting facts and anecdotes. After visiting the sepulchral chapel on Württemberg hill (from outside), the tour goes on towards the Museum of Viniculture in Uhlbach, where you will take a tour inside. The tour ends with a tasting of Swabian wines inside the modern wine shop.



WINE EVENTS

Vineyard Circular Tour on a Segway – Segway tour followed by wine tasting

Coasting along through the vines, you reach one of Stuttgart's most beautiful scenic lookout points – the Burial Chapel on the Württemberg hill, surrounded by vineyards, with views over Stuttgart and the Neckar Valley. There are more great prospects in store at the end of the tour during the wine tasting at the Stuttgart Museum of Viniculture, where you can enjoy wonderful wines from Stuttgart in the Vinothek – pure delight!

Friday evening winetasting – the perfect start into the weekend Every Friday

Start your weekend with a savour winetasting at the Vinothek of the Museum of Viniculture Stuttgart. A wine expert leads you through three excellent wines of different wine makers and qualifies you for being a real wine connoisseur of the middle region of the Neckar area. Enjoy this amusement every Friday with or also without reservation.
